What's Happening in your Pet's Mouth?

WARNING SIGNS

- Bad Breath
- Plaque and Tartar Build-up
- Sensitivity Around the Mouth
- Pawing at the Mouth
- Difficulty Chewing Food

- Loose or Missing Teeth
